OPP DRUG WARRANT EXECUTED – SOUTH HURON

(SOUTH HURON, ON) – On Wednesday, November 30, 2016, the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) Organized Crime Enforcement Bureau (OCEB) – Drug Enforcement Unit, West Region Emergency Response Team (ERT), West Region Canine, and Huron OPP, executed a Controlled Drugs and Substances Act search warrant at a residence located on St. Lawrence Avenue, in the Municipality of South Huron (Huron Park), Huron County, Ontario.

As a result of the execution of the search warrant, police seized methamphetamine, cannabis marihuana, and cannabis resin. The estimated, combined street value of the seized controlled substances is \$1,094.

Police also seized offence related property that consisted of cash, drug trafficking paraphernalia and a prohibited weapon (push button knife).

Police arrested and have laid charges against the following four people:

- Adam RICHARDS, 40 years of age from South Huron has been charged with Possession of Methamphetamine, Marihuana, and Cannabis Resin. Possession of a prohibited weapon and Unauthorized Possession of a Prohibited Weapon While Prohibited.
- Shelly-Lynne COLLINGS, 38 years of age from South Huron has been charged with Possession of Methamphetamine, Marihuana, Cannabis Resin and Possession of a Prohibited Weapon.
- Daniel HOFFMAN, 19 years of age from South Huron has been charged with Possession of Marihuana for the Purposes of Trafficking and Possession of Cannabis Marihuana.
- A Young Person from South Huron has also been charged with Possession of Marihuana for the Purposes of Trafficking and Possession of Cannabis Marihuana.

The charged persons have all been released with court appearances scheduled for February 23, 2017 at the Ontario Court of Justice – Goderich.

FESTIVE R.I.D.E CHECKPOINTS CONTINUE IN HURON COUNTY

(HURON COUNTY, ON) – Huron County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) officers have been very busy with their Festive Reduce Impaired Driving Everywhere (RIDE) checkpoints during the first two weeks of the annual campaign. A total of **116** checkpoints have been set up throughout the county.

The increased number of checkpoints and heightened public awareness during the Festive RIDE campaign will undoubtedly help to keep our Huron County roadways as safe as possible. With that being said, a small percentage of drivers still continue to take unnecessary risks and endanger others on the roadway.

Here are some of the highlights over the past weekend at our Huron County RIDE checkpoints.

- A 39-year-old male driver from Ashfield-Colborne-Wawanosh failed a roadside test and was charged with Over 80 after being stopped at a RIDE checkpoint located near Benmiller on Saturday, December 3, 2016
- A 34-year-old male driver from Windsor entered into a RIDE checkpoint in Dashwood on Saturday, December 3, 2016. He was found to be breaching his curfew conditions. In addition to this offence, his validation sticker on his licence plate was expired.
- A 46-year-old male from South Huron had open beer in his vehicle when he pulled into a RIDE checkpoint on Saturday afternoon in South Huron.
- A 62-year-old driver from Clinton attempted to avoid a RIDE checkpoint set up in Morris-Turnberry on Sunday afternoon. Officers stopped the driver and he was found to have open alcohol in his truck.

- A 46-year-old male driver from Huron East entered into a RIDE checkpoint located on Kinburn Line at Front Road on Sunday evening. He had open alcohol in his truck and his breath sample registered in the warn range. He was served with a 3-day suspension and was ticketed for the open alcohol offence.

Huron OPP officers will continue with their Festive RIDE checks all through the month of December and through to the first weekend in January 2017. If you plan to drink or consume drugs do not get behind the wheel. Arrange for a designated driver, take a taxi, stay overnight or take public transit. If you suspect that someone is driving or is about to drive impaired, please call 9-1-1 and report it.

THIEF STEALS CHRISTMAS PRESENTS INTENDED FOR NEEDY KIDS

(SOUTH HURON, ON) – A recent theft of Christmas presents could have made for just another sad story that we sometimes here about this time of year; however, this story has a different ending - a much nicer one!

This story started last Friday evening when a kind and generous local citizen went out to purchase some Christmas presents for the less fortunate children in the local area. The victim made several purchases and had built up a nice collection of colouring books, craft supplies, board games and toys all destined for a local church Christmas toy drive.

The victim needed to get some batteries for the toys so she stopped in at the Canadian Tire store in Exeter and quickly went inside to finish up her shopping. When she returned to her vehicle she realized someone had entered into her locked vehicle and stole a red plastic bag that contained all of the presents.

The victim was understandably upset about what had happened and the next day she reported the theft to the Huron Detachment OPP officers. Officers took her report and initiated an investigation to identify and apprehend the thief. It's now one week into the investigation, and unfortunately officers have been unable to identify a suspect. This isn't the only update to this case though.

It turns out the officers working in Exeter that day didn't want this woman's act of kindness to go unnoticed. So they each chipped in some money to purchase some replacement toys. The Canadian Tire Store eagerly matched and even exceeded the officers' donation and collectively they were able to come up with a sizable sack of toys for the victim.

"It just felt like the right thing to do. She was trying to do something great at this time of the year, and we didn't want someone to take that away from her. We knew those toys were destined for the less fortunate and we wanted to make sure that still happened." commented Huron County OPP Provincial Constable Jason Richardson.

Yesterday afternoon, Huron OPP officers met the victim at the Canadian Tire store and were able to surprise the victim with an assortment of toys and sporting goods. The unsuspecting victim was left nearly speechless; however, the smile on her face and the tears in her eyes said it all.

EXETER DRIVER FAILS ROADSIDE TEST

(SOUTH HURON, ON) – A 23-year-old from Exeter is facing an Over 80 charge following a traffic stop that took place last Friday night.

Shortly before 8:00 p.m. on December 9, 2016 Huron County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) officers received information about an open alcohol offence taking place on Main Street South in Exeter. Officers responded to the area and located the suspect vehicle, a Chevrolet Impala parked in a convenience store parking lot. Upon approaching the vehicle the investigating officer observed an open container of alcohol inside the vehicle. Also, while speaking with the driver the officer noted the driver had been consuming some alcohol.

As a result, the driver provided a roadside sample of his breath into a roadside screening device and he registered a Fail. He was placed under arrest and was transported to the Exeter OPP Detachment for breath tests. He subsequently provided two samples of his breath to a qualified Intoxilizer Technician and both of these samples registered over the legal limit.

As a result, 23-year-old Alex HERN from Exeter has been charged with Care & Control of a Motor Vehicle – Over 80 Milligrams of Alcohol. He was released from custody with a court appearance scheduled for January 26, 2017 at the Ontario Court of Justice – Exeter. He also received an automatic 90-day driver's licence suspension and his motor vehicle was impounded.

RACING CHARGE LAID

(SOUTH HURON, ON) – A female driver from Port Stanley has been charged with Racing following a traffic stop that took place on December 6, 2016. At 3:26 p.m. a Huron County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) officer observed a Jeep Wrangler traveling eastbound on Mt. Carmel Road at a high rate of speed. The officer confirmed his visual observations of the approaching vehicle with a RADAR device and confirmed the speed of the racing vehicle at a speed in excess of 60 km/h over the posted 90 km/h speed limit. A traffic stop was initiated and the driver was subsequently charged.

Joanne TINGLE, 46 years of age, from Port Stanley has been charged with "Race a Motor Vehicle". She has a court appearance scheduled for January 17, 2016 at Provincial Offences Act Court in Goderich. Her licence was suspended for seven days and her Jeep vehicle was impounded for the week.

HURON COUNTY OPP TRAVEL ADVISORY – NUMEROUS ROADWAYS CLOSED

(HURON COUNTY, ON) – Huron County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) is warning motorists throughout several parts of Huron County to stay off roadways and avoid unnecessary travel. Numerous sections of roadways are currently impassable due to heaving drifting and nil visibility.

This morning Huron OPP officers have responded to numerous vehicles in the ditch to assist stranded motorists. As of 8:00 a.m. Huron County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) has closed the following roadways:

- Bluewater Veterans Highway (Highway 21) from Amberley to Bayfield
- Huron Road (Highway 8) from Goderich to Dublin
- London Road (County 4) from Clinton to Wingham
- Mill Road (County 3) from Bayfield to Brucefield
- Amberley Road (County 86) from Bluewater Veteran's Highway through to Molesworth
- Harriston Road (County 87) from Bluevale to Harriston

Attempting to drive on these roadways is currently hazardous and should not be attempted. Do not jeopardize your safety by driving on these roadways.

Motorists should also be aware that other roadways such as local municipal roadways may not be suitable for travel and motorists should exercise good judgement and avoid all unnecessary travel until the conditions improve.

Additional Roadways Now Closed

(HURON COUNTY, ON) – Huron County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) is warning motorists throughout several parts of Huron County to stay off roadways and avoid unnecessary travel. Two collisions have been reported to Huron County OPP within the last hour. At approximately 8:45 a.m. a Huron County OPP cruiser was rear-ended on Highway 4 near Vanastra. No injuries were reported.

Also, at approximately 9:10 a.m. Huron County OPP received a report of another property related collision involving several vehicles on Bluewater Veteran's Highway near MTO Road just north of Goderich. No injuries have been reported.

OPP PARTICIPATING IN PROVINCE-WIDE “LOCK IT OR LOSE IT” CAMPAIGN

(HURON COUNTY, ON) – Huron County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) is reminding motorists and passengers to “Lock it OR Lose it” when it comes to their vehicles and valuables as part of the Ontario Association of Chiefs of Police’s (OACP) annual “Lock It OR Lose It” campaign.

Ontario police services have launched this year’s “Lock It OR Lose It” campaign during the holiday season because it’s easy to be distracted and leave vehicles unlocked or valuables in plain sight during the holiday hustle-and-bustle.

During the “Lock It OR Lose It” campaign, police officers and auxiliary officers will be checking vehicles throughout various centres in Huron County to confirm vehicles are locked and that no valuables have been left in plain view. Members will place a small notice on vehicles checked indicating what safety precautions were neglected and offer simple prevention tips for drivers to protect their vehicles against theft. The notices also congratulate drivers who have secured their vehicle.

This year, police are particularly concerned that auto theft rates are up for the second consecutive year. According to the Insurance Bureau of Canada, there were nearly 79,000 incidents of motor vehicle theft reported by police in 2015. Between 2014 and 2015, the rate of motor vehicle theft in Canada increased 6%. This was the second consecutive increase in the rate following ten years of declines. Huron OPP has also noticed a recent spike in the number of vehicle thefts, in particular pickup trucks and recreation vehicles.

Motorists and passengers are also urged not to keep personal documents such as vehicle ownership, insurance slips, credit card invoices, or other documents containing personal information in their vehicles. Identity thieves are looking for such documents so they can assume identities, secure credit card accounts, lease vehicles for export, and even take out a mortgage against victims’ properties without their knowledge. Huron OPP officers have also recently investigated cases of vehicle theft where firearms and expensive power tools have been left behind in insecure vehicles.

Please protect your vehicle and valuables from theft with a few simple precautions. The attached graphic contains the Top 10 Tips provided by the Ontario Association of Chiefs of Police and the Insurance Bureau of Canada.



SEARCH CONTINUES FOR DECEASED'S NEXT-OF-KIN

(HURON COUNTY, ON) - Investigators from the Huron County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) Crime Unit have a mystery on their hands and they are hopeful someone, somewhere can help them solve it.

It was October 15, 2016 when a deceased male was found on a beach of the shores of Lake Huron just north of Port Albert. Huron OPP was contacted and an investigation immediately commenced. Police are still seeking the public's assistance in locating the Next-of-Kin of the victim.

Despite a very thorough investigation, including an exhaustive search of all accessible databases, widespread media coverage and over a hundred tips from the public, investigators have not been able to confirm the identity of this male.

Investigators have discovered that a journalist working in northern Ontario had captured photos of the victim near Espanola Ontario in September. It was further determined that the victim was traveling from Alberta to Ontario. He identified himself to the journalist as **Mitchell NELSON** and provided an age of **57** years. He also indicated that he was travelling to visit family and friends in the London area and that he also had relatives toward the Ottawa area.

Investigators are confident this male has friends and family somewhere and it is just a matter of time before someone comes forward to help investigators solve this mystery. "We remain optimistic a family member, friend, acquaintance, former co-worker, or former classmate will hear about this investigation and will come forward to help us with this investigation. Our priority is finding this man's next of kin and we are confident it will happen." - **Huron County OPP Crime Unit - Detective Sergeant Mike McCabe**

Police would like to speak with anyone who has information about the male depicted in the attached photos.

The victim is described as:

- White, male
- Average to medium build
- Balding with grey hair.
- Thin moustache.
- Approximately 30-60 years old.

Clothing:

- Blue "Fluid" lifejacket.
- Black fleece type pullover/jacket
- Black wind pants with letter "PEP" on a shield.
- White and black Nike running shoes.
