### **FUEL THEFT PREVENTION TIPS**

**(HURON COUNTY, ON)** – Huron County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) is offering the following tips to the public to help prevent fuel theft following some recent cases that have taken place in Huron County.

On January 16, 2017 at approximately 5:30 a.m. an attempt was made to siphon gasoline from a company vehicle parked at a business located on Victoria Street in Gorrie. The suspect was unsuccessful, thanks to a locking gas cap that had been installed by the owner. The suspect was operating a Ford F-250 extended cab with a large dent in the passenger side of the vehicle.

Huron OPP is also investigating two thefts of fuel that took place on back to back nights this week in Fordwich. On Monday, January 30<sup>th</sup> around 7:15 p.m. a male suspect attended a business located on Old Mill Street and used a hose to siphon fuel from one of the company vehicles. He used a red plastic fuel canister to transport the stolen fuel.

The following evening a vehicle owner from Louisa Street also reported someone stole some fuel from their vehicle.

Here are some tips to help prevent fuel theft:

#### **CONSUMERS/HOMEOWNERS**

- Consider installing a locking gas cap.
- Avoid parking in dark, isolated areas – especially for extended periods of time.
- Park your vehicle in a locked garage. If you don't have a garage, park next to the house in a well-lit area.

- If you have to park on the street or in a parking lot. Park your vehicle so the fuel door is plainly visible.
- If you have bulk fuels on your property, lock the tank and the dispenser to prevent unauthorized access. Ensure the power supply to the pump is turned off.
- Call the police if you see suspicious activity around fuel tanks or parked vehicles. Try to record suspect / suspect vehicle descriptions.
- A barking dog can act as a great tool to deter criminal activity on your property.
- Be suspicious of any strangers that enter onto your property, keep in mind they may be scoping out your property.

#### **RETAILERS**

- Consider prepayment or pay at pump.
- Install and maintain a high quality video surveillance system.
- Be alert and vigilant. Consider greeting customers over an intercom system.
- Record licence plate numbers before activating fuel pump.
- Locate the cash drawer so the clerk has an unobstructed view of the fuel pumps.
- Consider a reward system for customers that provide information that leads to identifying a gas thief.
- If you have a gas theft, record the date, time, suspect description, vehicle description and licence plate number.

#### **COMMUNITY SATISFACTION SURVEY HELPS OPP ASSESS SERVICE TO ONTARIANS**

**(HURON COUNTY, ON)** – A Community Satisfaction Survey is currently underway in West Region and you may end up getting a cold call seeking your input. The West Region surveys started in January in an effort to solicit public opinions about the services the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) detachments deliver to communities throughout the region.

The Community Satisfaction Survey is a telephone survey that randomly selects members of the public (16 years or older) who live in Ontario. The survey takes about five to seven minutes to complete and is strictly voluntary. Those contacted and willing to participate are asked about issues such as community security, perceptions of crime and youth issues in the community, OPP presence in the community, service delivery and even how the OPP investigates crime and enforces the law.

The information provided by those surveyed is being collected by a research consultant, R.A. Malatest & Associates Ltd. that has been retained by the Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services. The information is treated confidentially and the names, telephone numbers, and addresses of those surveyed will not be included in the survey results provided to the OPP.

Once the survey is complete, the results will be used in the OPP Business Action Plan and Annual Report. The information will also be useful in helping OPP's West Region set out goals and objectives to improve on the services it delivers to communities across the Region. These surveys are done throughout the province on a rotational three year schedule.

The West Region detachment surveys started in January and are expected to be completed by March 30, 2017. The Ontario Provincial Police would like to thank those who participate in the Community Satisfaction Survey and who take the time to help the OPP in its vision of Safe Communities.....A Secure Ontario.

### **3-DAY SUSPENSION SERVED ON DRIVER**

**(SOUTH HURON, ON)** – A 31-year-old from South Huron was issued a 3-day driver’s licence suspension following a traffic stop that took place last night just north of Grand Bend. At approximately 8:45 p.m. the driver of a pickup truck entered into a R.I.D.E (Reduce Impaired Driving Everywhere) checkpoint that was set up on Bluewater Veteran’s Highway near Indian Road.

A Huron County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) officer spoke with the driver and noted the driver had been consuming some alcohol. A roadside screening test was administered and the driver registered a “Warn”. As a result the 31-year-old male driver from South Huron was served with a 3-day driver’s licence suspension.

### **THIEVES STEAL HEAVY DUTY PICNIC TABLE**

**(SOUTH HURON, ON)** – It certainly is the off season for outdoor picnics however some thieves in the South Huron area felt the time was right to swipe a heavy duty wooden picnic table.

The wooden picnic table was recently constructed by some community volunteers and it had been gifted to the Municipality of South Huron. The table was stolen sometime overnight on February 3, 2017 from the Thames Road/Elimville Line Park. It was one of two tables that had been stored underneath a covered shelter at that location.

It appears as though the thieves loaded the table onto a trailer and drove away.

The table is valued at approximately \$1,000.

### **THEFT FROM MOTOR VEHICLE**

**(SOUTH HURON, ON)** – Huron County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) officers including members from the Huron County Property Crimes Unit are currently investigating a theft from a motor vehicle occurrence.

Sometime between 9:30 a.m. on February 4<sup>th</sup> and 9:00 a.m. on February 5<sup>th</sup>, 2017 someone entered into an unlocked GMC that was parked in a parking lot located on Victoria Street West in Exeter. The thief entered into the vehicle and stole a wallet that contained several pieces of identification as well as an engagement ring and a wedding ring.

The yellow and white gold wedding & engagement rings are valued at approximately \$1200.



### **POLICE DO NOT SEND OUT TRAFFIC TICKET NOTICES VIA EMAIL**

**(HURON COUNTY, ON)** – Huron County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) would like to warn residents about a recent scam that landed in the inbox of a South Huron resident. In this case, had it not been for anti-virus software installed on the target's computer she may have fallen victim to the scam. It all started when the 63-year-old received an email that had the subject title "TRAFFIC INFRINGEMENT NOTICE 5575482". Inquisitively she opened up the email and read the following simple statement – "You have been issued with a traffic infringement. Reason: Negligent Driving, Infringement No: 056332875, Amount Due **\$577.79 CAD**, This fine must be paid within the statutory period of up to 2011.11.2016"

Embedded in the email was a hyperlink, and it was clicked on by the target in an attempt to view her "offence notice". Fortunately, her computer had an up-to-date antivirus program and it identified the attachment as a potential threat. The email address was successfully blocked and the email was disposed of in the junk folder.

#### **Warning Signs – How to Protect Yourself**

- Beware of unsolicited emails from individuals or organizations prompting you to click on an attachment or link.
- Watch for spelling and formatting errors.
- Check the embedded hyperlink in the suspicious email by hovering your mouse over the link to verify the address.
- Go with your gut. If an email seems fishy, it probably is.

### **HOME RANSACKED & THREE FIREARMS STOLEN**

**(SOUTH HURON, ON)** – Huron County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) officers including members of the Huron OPP Property Crimes Unit continue to investigate a break, enter and theft that took place in Crediton last week.

Sometime between 9:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. on February 16, 2017 those responsible attended a Victoria Avenue residence whereupon they entered into the residence through a rear patio door. Once inside the residence the home was ransacked and several items were stolen including three firearms.

The following items have been reported as stolen:

- A brown, GSG-STG semi-automatic .22 calibre Model 44 rifle.
- A 410 Classic single shot shotgun

### **BREAK, ENTER & THEFT – EXETER**

**(SOUTH HURON, ON)** - Huron County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) officers including members of the Huron OPP Property Crimes Unit continue to investigate a daytime break, enter and theft that took place in Exeter last week.

Sometime between 10:45 a.m. and 11:10 a.m. on February 15, 2017 a thief attended a residence located on Victoria Street West and entered into the home through an unlocked door. Once inside the residence the thief located and stole several items.

The stolen items included a Sony PlayStation game console, a rose coloured Bulova men's wrist watch, a charcoal grey coloured wrist watch and some loose change.

The total value of the stolen property is estimated at approximately \$1,000.

A suspect vehicle was spotted near the residence around the time of the theft. It was described as a tan or beige coloured late 1990's or early 2000's Cadillac or Lincoln.

### **HAVE YOU CHECKED ON YOUR COTTAGE PROPERTY?**

**(HURON COUNTY, ON)** - The Huron County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) Detachment is reminding the public to properly secure and check on your vacation home as frequently as possible to help reduce the number of break-ins and thefts.

On Monday, February 20th, 2017 Huron OPP officers responded to three separate break, enter and theft occurrences in Port Albert. In all three cases the thief forced entry into the cottages through an exterior window. In two of the cases, the thief used ladders that were conveniently left behind on the property to assist in gaining access into the cottages.

At this point it appears as though property was stolen from only one of the cottages. A flat screen television, a Blu-ray player and a Bose IPod docking station were stolen from a Victoria Beach Road cottage.

Huron OPP advises all vacation property owners to ensure that all valuables and alcohol are removed from the premises. Small appliances, electronics and alcohol are often targeted by thieves as they are easy to steal and equally easy to sell.

Additionally, a simple way to protect your property is to MARK IT. Engraving valuables with an identifier is simple and deters criminals from stealing them. Property that is easily identified is less likely to be stolen due to the permanent engraving that makes it difficult for the criminal to sell. Using an electric engraver, scratch all, or a ball point pen will permanently mark your property. Engraving your vehicle licence plate number on your valuables is an easy way to quickly identify your property. By using your licence plate number, police are also able to trace your property. Every year thousands of dollars of recovered valuables are sold at police auctions because it cannot be identified and returned to the rightful owner.

Police encourage property owners to have someone check their vacation property daily during the "off-season" to ensure everything is secure. The OPP also encourages anyone that sees anything suspicious in the area to call police immediately to make a report.

**Remember, Crime Prevention Starts With You!** Huron OPP urges everyone to think proactively and to do what you can to remove the opportunities for crime to occur.
