- Traffic Stats – comparable numbers to – no dramatic increases
- OPP Traffic Initiatives shared with the Board
- Concerning Trend – impaired drivers have doubled over 2022
- R.I.D.E. programs have increased throughout the County
- R.I.D.E. programs have, and will be, conducted in different areas and will expand on the media coverage, creating more awareness
- Snapshot of the Focus Patrols were discussed
- Foot and bike patrols – more visible in Exeter core
- Foot patrols – will sustain this practice throughout the winter months as well
- Reviewed and expanded on the Media Releases
- OPP continue to partner with the Women’s Shelter and Victim Services – the three entities work together to address concerns/occurrences surrounding intimate partner violence – encourage victims to come forward and report sexual assaults

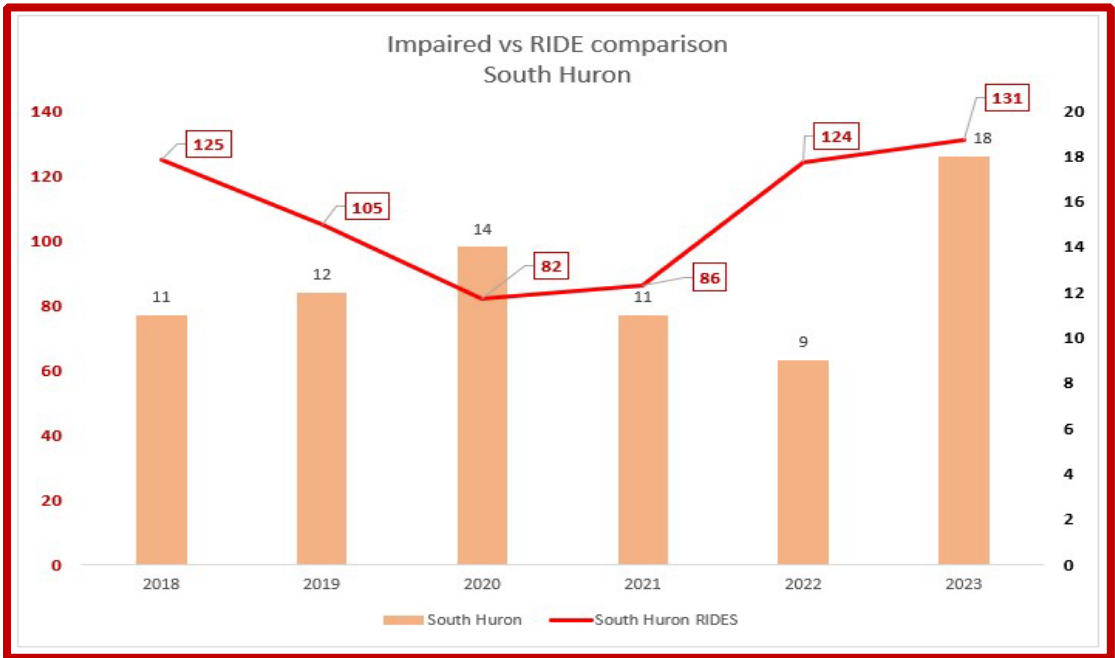
FIVE-YEAR ANALYSIS - SOUTH HURON







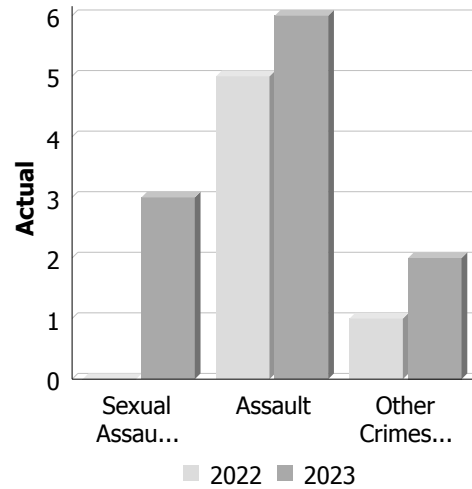
