- R.I.D.E. Programs – 11 were held in October, with no impaired drivers
- Festive R.I.D.E. programs are now underway
- E-Tickets issued – 117 – double year over year
- E-Warn – 44 issued
- Comparison to 2022 – 67 E-Tickets and 23 E-Warnings
- Focus patrols – Distracted driving at Thames Road at Main Street North – no occurrences and no infractions – 4.5 hours
- Community mobilization – 7.25 hours
- Community services incidents – 25 hours
- Foot patrol hours – 15.5 hours
- Cruiser patrols – 447.25 hours
- Media Release – Officers in Huron County partnered with the youth at Clinton Public School – Pumpkin carving – positive interaction with the youth – kids and Officers enjoyed this experience
- Beware as scams continue throughout the County

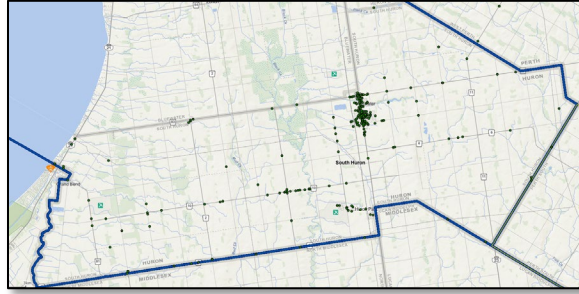

SOUTH HURON INCIDENTS – GEOGRAPHICALLY (326)



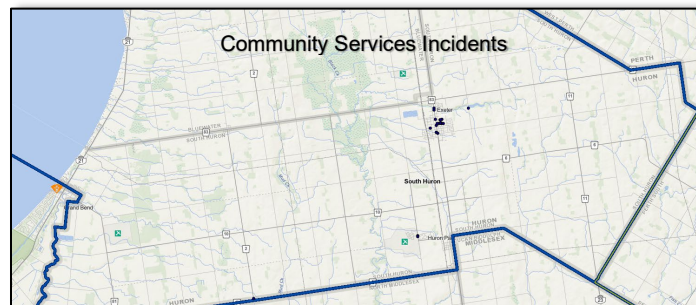
