### **6. O.P.P. Report**

- Detailed report for October was distributed prior to the meeting for review and to allow for effective discussion at the Board meeting
- Staff Sgt David Sinko and Inspector/Interim Commander Rob Scott provided a comprehensive overview and explanation of the report
- Calls for service were down considerably compared to the last two years – COVID has played a significant role in reduced numbers – people are not out and about as much as in the past – reduced calls for services are reflective in other Huron County communities
- Reviewed the DAR – Community Safety statistics
- Noted that Four R.I.D.E. programs were conducted in October in South Huron
- Block Training resumed in September
- School resource officer – seeking backfill person during absence of resource officers
- Reviewed and explained Noteworthy Occurrences
- Mental Health calls have increased over the same period last year
- Detachment and Community Pressures were shared and discussed with the Board membership
- OPP are conducting compliance checks on people returning to Huron County after travelling in other Provinces and/or Countries
- People that have travelled must quarantine for 14 days – OPP are ensuring compliance
- Criminal Records Checks – efficiencies identified in the process - update provided
- Calls for Service Billing Summary Report – Down just over 1,000 hours year over year
- Proactive policing work continues
- Calls for Service Billing Summary - Chair Dietrich questioned how the hours were determined under the “Time Standard” column – Contract Policing – This is a Provincial average established to allocate hours to a specific call for service
- Chair Dietrich thanked Staff Sgt Sinko and Inspector/Interim Commander Rob Scott for providing the overview, explanation and background information
