**6. O.P.P. Report**

- Detailed report for March was distributed prior to the meeting for review and to allow for effective discussion at the Board meeting
- Inspector Jason Younan provided a comprehensive overview and explanation of the report for the month
- Media Release indicating increase in impaired driving incidents
- Seat belt campaign is scheduled from April 14 – 19, 2022
- 48 etickets and 29 warning were issued for the month of March
- In an attempt to create more engagement and awareness of Victim Services, OPP have invited staff to attend Front-Line Platoon meetings to engage with Officers, along with ride-a-longs – visual reminder of the shared partnership for both Officers and the public
- Violent crime remains a concern within the County
- Property crimes – one break and enter
- Theft under – majority of the incidents were gas drive offs
- On line frauds continue to impact victim lives
- Clearance rates – Due to great policing, clearance rates to date are 25%, which was the target goal for 2022 very impressed and proud of the members
- Calls for Service – Almost half of the hours compared to 2021
- Community Safety and Well-Being Plan – please refer to the two-page document contained within the OPP Report
- Inspector Younan provided a wholesome overview of the priority areas of the Plan and their correlation to Policing
- He reviewed each element and the specific tie to Policing and the work being done in each of the focus areas
- Noted that the Out of the Cold Shelter program closes on Thursday – focus on how to intervene to keep everyone safe
- Contact numbers of supports are available
- Suggested that awareness surrounding the Elderly Project Lifesaver and a program through medic alert would be beneficial
- Jamie Stanley is a great resource to provide education – will discuss next steps at the May meeting
- Inspector Younan noted that as a result of the anticipated Provincial Election, he would be away from the Huron Detachment from April 18 – June 06, 2022 to assist with political party leader security
- Acting Inspector Ryan Olmstead will assist in his absence
- Ryan has the necessary knowledge, skills and abilities to function extremely well in this role
- Chair Dietrich thanked Inspector Younan for providing the report, for the continued support and for the great working relationship between the Board and the Detachment staff

- On Thursday, March 17, 2022 at 9:00 am, a meeting was scheduled with Rebekah Msuya-Collison, General Manager of Corporate Services/Clerk, Jim Dietrich, South Huron Police Services Board Chair and Jo-Anne Fields, Secretary to discuss options of next steps in moving forward with the Community Safety and Well-Being Plan
- Brief overview of the meeting –
  - o We discussed identifying seniors as the proposed focus group
  - o We discussed perhaps coordinating some type of meeting (whether virtual/in-person or combination depending on the circumstances)
  - o The Plan will be discussed at an upcoming Police Services Board meeting to discuss whether the Board wants to proceed with an initiative, keep carrying the Plan until legislation is passed or give back to Council
  - o A list of sample questions for the Board to consider if it is decided to proceed on an outreach initiative
  - o We discussed whether the Board would proceed with any initiatives at this time as new legislation is expected and the other Municipalities have put their plans on hold at this time. We discussed that this is a Council initiative and that while the Board is monitoring the Plan on Council’s behalf, a report to provide Council an update after a decision is made on moving forward and who will assume the lead on this initiative
- The Plan outlines seniors as one of the priority populations in Huron so an initiative with Seniors would fit. There are four priority areas listed in the Plan:
  1. Mental Health and Addictions
  2. Housing Stability and Homelessness
  3. Domestic and Family Violence
  4. Community Security
- Discussed that the 4<sup>th</sup> priority, Community Security may be a good fit for the South Huron Police Services Board
- Discussed areas/populations that the Board could reach out to, creating awareness and education surrounding concerns and issues

- Was suggested that a Board meeting could be scheduled at an outside venue – Grand Cove, Community Centre, High School
- Further discussion will be held at the regular May Police Services Board meeting

## Easter Long Weekend Traffic Initiative

Huron County OPP participated in a Provincial Traffic Initiative over the Easter Long Weekend, where officers conducted over 150 traffic stops leading to 91 speeding charges, 17 seatbelt infractions and 27 other Highway Traffic Act offences across Huron County.

## Media Releases

### **RACING CHARGE LAID**

**(SOUTH HURON, ON)** – Huron County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) has charged a London resident with Racing – Excessive Speed following a traffic stop last night.

At approximately 7:15 p.m. a Huron OPP officer was conducting stationary RADAR enforcement on London Road (Highway 4) south of Exeter when he observed a delivery van travelling southbound at a high rate of speed.

The officer utilized a RADAR device and was able to obtain a speed reading of the vehicle in excess of 50 km/h over the posted 80 km/h speed limit. A traffic stop was initiated and the driver was subsequently charged.

Obaida ALHAIDAR, 23 years of age from London has been charged with Race a Motor Vehicle – Excessive Speed. The defendant will now have to attend Provincial Offences Act Court in Goderich to answer to the charge.

Additionally, the van has been impounded for 14 days and a 30-day driver's licence suspension has been served on the driver.

## **CAUGHT WITH A STOLEN TRUCK**

**(SOUTH HURON, ON)** – A resident of Parkhill is facing criminal charges following an incident that took place in Huron Park last week.

On April 6, 2022 at approximately 10:42 a.m. Huron OPP officers responded to a business located on Canada Boulevard to investigate an attempted theft. Upon arrival officers learned the accused was caught in the act of trying to steal a catalytic converter off of a vehicle parked in the company parking lot. The theft was interrupted and the accused fled the scene in a pickup truck.

Officers began patrolling for the suspect and a short time later an officer located the suspect vehicle in Centralia. When spotted by police the driver took off running however the officer was able to locate and arrest the accused. Further checks were made on the vehicle the accused was driving and it was determined to be stolen from London a few days earlier.

Shawn THOMPSON, 37 years of age from Parkhill has been charged with Theft Under \$5,000, Possession of Property Obtained by Crime Over \$5,000 and Driving While Under Suspension.

The accused was released from custody with a court appearance scheduled for June 6, 2022 at the Ontario Court of Justice – Goderich.

## **TRAFFIC COMPLAINT LEADS TO IMPAIRED DRIVING CHARGE**

**(SOUTH HURON, ON)** – Huron County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) has charged a South Huron resident with Impaired Operation following a traffic complaint investigated by police earlier this month.

On Saturday, April 16, 2022 at approximately 10:13 p.m. members from the Huron OPP Detachment responded to a report of a mini-van travelling northbound on London Road in an erratic manner.

A Huron OPP officer was able to intercept the vehicle in question on London Road at Kirkton Road and a traffic stop was initiated. Upon speaking with the driver the investigating officer noted open alcohol inside the vehicle, as well, the driver was observed to be displaying several signs of impairment.

As a result the driver was placed under arrest for Impaired Operation and was transported to the Lucan OPP Detachment for breath tests. Two samples of breath were provided to the Intoxilizer Technician and both tests were found to be above the legal limit.

Bradley SCHAUS, 48 years of age from Exeter has been charged with Operation While Impaired and Operation While Impaired – Blood Alcohol Concentration (80 Plus). The accused has since been released from custody with a court appearance scheduled for June 6, 2022 at the Ontario Court of Justice – Goderich.



## **80 PLUS CHARGE LAID - EXETER**

**(SOUTH HURON, ON)** – Huron County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) has charged a Lucan resident with Operation While Impaired – Blood Alcohol Concentration (80 Plus) following a traffic stop conducted by Huron County Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) last week.

On Thursday, April 21, 2022 at approximately 2:29 a.m. members from the Huron OPP Detachment responded to a report of a station wagon that was being operated in an erratic manner traveling northbound through Lucan.

Shortly after a Huron OPP officer was able to intercept the suspect vehicle in Exeter and a traffic stop was conducted on Huron Street West. Upon speaking with the driver the investigating officer noted the driver had consumed some alcohol. As a result the driver completed a roadside screening test and registered a “Fail”.

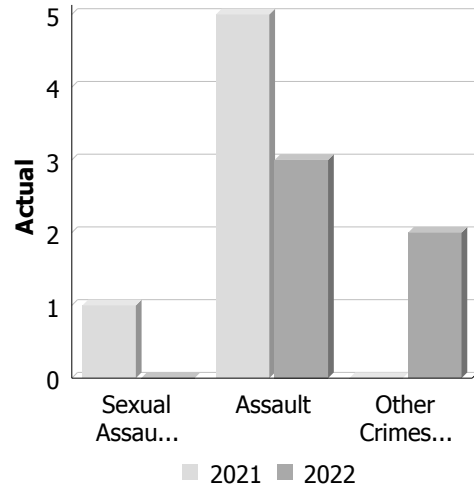
Consequently the driver was placed under arrest and was transported to the Huron OPP Detachment for breath tests. Two samples of breath were provided to the Intoxilizer Technician and both tests were found to be above the legal limit.

Trevor WILLIAMS, 30 years of age from Lucan has been charged with Operation While Impaired – Blood Alcohol Concentration (80 Plus). The accused has since been released from custody with a court appearance scheduled for May 30, 2022 at the Ontario Court of Justice – Goderich.

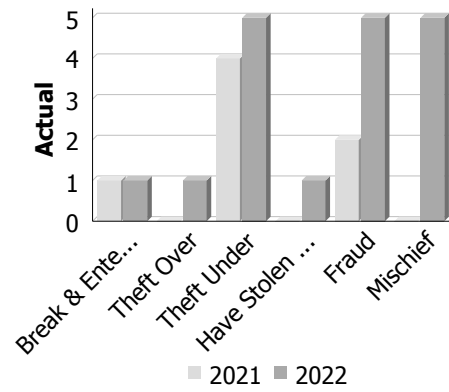

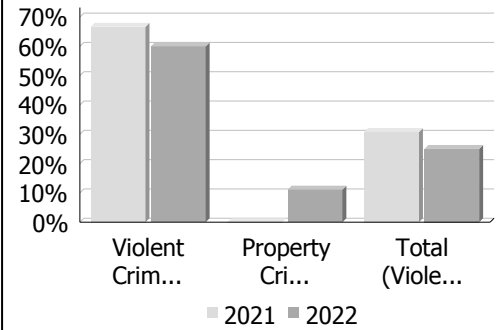
